Types



REQUESTS FOR INFORMATION



Learner wishes to know more information on a topic

- "I don't know...but I can find out"
- Answer in an age-appropriate manner
- If values based, share various points of view

VALUES BASED

Learner wishes to learn about values

- Difficult because we aim to be value free
- Focus on universal values
 - Exploitation is wrong
 - Responsibility is good
 - Everyone deserves to be safe and respected
- SOY: Some...Others...You reflect on what is important to you and your family



PERSONAL



Learner wishes to know more about the facilitator

- Establish boundaries ahead of time via group agreements
- DON'T share information about personal sexual practices or personal beliefs

AM I NORMAL?



Learner wishes to know how they compare to their peers

- Affirm the Learn
 - ∘ "I get that question a lot"
- Share range of what is common
 - Avoid use of the word "normal"
- Refer to other resources as appropriate
 - Parents, family physician, school counselor, other trusted adult etc.

SHOCK VALUE



Learner does not know proper terminology

- Reword question using medically accurate language
- Establish ground rule about using proper vocabulary

Learner wishes to get a reaction from you and/or the class

- Refer to group agreements if inappropriate or problematic question
- Call in vs call out

WHAT OTHER TIPS MAY BE HELPFUL IN ANSWERING SENSITIVE QUESTIONS?

ADDITIONAL TIPS



Before

- Gain time by letting learners answer first
- Ask, Listen, Share
- Keep up with pop culture and slang references

During

- Model comfort...or not
- Be honest about not knowing and complex questions
- Humor is okay
- Use a trauma-informed lens.
